#### **Remember-mode Integration**

See the manual for how to make remember.el use Org-mode links and files. The note-finishing command C-c C-c will first prompt for an org file. In the file, find a location with:

rotate subtree visibility	TAB
next heading	DOWN
previous heading	UP
Insert the note with one of the following:	
as sublevel of heading at cursor	RET
right here (cursor not on heading)	RET
before current heading	LEFT
after current heading	RIGHT
shortcut to end of buffer (cursor at buf-start)	RET
Abort	9

#### Completion

In-buffer completion completes TODO keywords at headline start, TeX macros after "\", option keywords after "#-", TAGS after ":", and dictionary words elsewhere.

## **Exporting and Publishing**

Exporting creates files with extensions .txt and .html in the current directory. Publishing puts the resulting file into some other place.

#### Export options

Include additional information for export by putting these anywhere in the org file. Use M-TAB completion to make sure to get the right keywords. M-TAB again just after keyword is complete inserts examples.

#### Comments: Text not being exported

Text before the first headline is not considered part of the document and is therefore never exported. Lines starting with # are comments and are not exported. Subtrees whose header starts with COMMENT are never exported.
